

clothing, and dishes, and it without metal tools or nails.



A totem pole is like a storybook. Each figure on a pole is a symbol, and it is a way of passing a message from one generation to another. The **birds** and animals represent a tribe, clan, family, or person. Some totem poles tell about an event. Others are made to **honour** a family. 1

The most common colours used were black, red, blue, green, and white. Each colour has a meaning.
